

Doing our bit to keep the nation caring

Funded L2 Level 2 Certificate in Principles of Medication Handling and Administration for Care Settings (RQF) and Care Certificate (Knowledge)*

Virtual training for new and existing adult social care workers

To continue to train and prepare new workers into the adult social care sector in the shadow of Covid-19, we have devised a new training route combining video conferencing and electronic workbooks.

Learners will get the same standard of personalised training as ever, but without the need to leave home to go to class.

All learners will need is access to a Laptop/PC/Tablet, a reasonable understanding of written and spoken English, and the commitment to spend 5-6 hours a day studying with us.

For employers, this training will be covered by the same Skills for Care Workforce Development Funding as our previous classroom sessions – so it's still fully funded**

We will aim to complete most learners over 4 days of virtual study with us, and keep you updated as they progress.

We are expecting high demand for this fully funded training, as being a key/essential worker will qualify people to send their children to school, get special shopping slots and travel without restriction.

How it works

As soon as you recruit a learner, pass their details on to us (Name, Email & Telephone details).

We'll get in touch with the learner and send them a link to complete their course registration.

We will then put them through the following programme of activities:

Day 1

Attend a 1 hr Skype conference with their tutor and other learners in their group. We keep each group down to around 5 learners per tutor to keep things simple and personal.

The tutor will run through learner's induction, outline the support they'll get and get them working on day 1 activities.

At the end of day 1 they will be expected to have completed unit 1 of the Level 2 Certificate in Principles of Medication Handling and Administration for Care Settings (RQF)

Day 2

Attend a second Skype conference with their tutor and other learners in their group.

The tutor will outline the day's activities and learning goals, answer questions and feedback to learners on their progress.

At the end of day 2 learners will be expected to have completed unit 2 of the Level 2 Certificate in Principles of Medication Handling and Administration for Care Settings (RQF), and to have made a start on unit 3, the longest part of the course.

Day 3

Attend a third Skype conference with their tutor and other learners in their group.

The tutor will again outline the day's activities and learning goals, answer questions and feedback to learners on their progress.

At the end of day 3 learners will be expected to have completed unit 3 of the Level 2 Certificate in Principles of Medication Handling and Administration for Care Settings (RQF)

Day 4

Attend a third Skype conference with their tutor and other learners in their group.

The tutor will again outline the day's activities and learning goals, answer questions and feedback to learners on their progress.

At the end of day 3 learners will be expected to have completed those sections of the Care Certificate (Knowledge) that are not covered already within the L2 Medication programme.

Day 5

The tutor will assess all learners work and liaise with both them and the employer as to their progress.

Any learners with outstanding work will be assisted with any issues they have and guided through to completion.

At all points of their study, learners will have access to their tutors during working hours for email and telephone support.

At any point, should a learner need an extension or deferment of their studies, they can apply to us for consideration of their request.
